God not only desires your success, but He is committed to helping His people become successful. He desires for His people to be blessed and to experience whole-person prosperity.



God Is Committed To You Becoming Successful.

 Nehemiah was a man in the Bible who believed and claimed God's success for himself. When he heard news that the walls and gates of Jerusalem lay in ruins, he began to fast and pray about the situation. The king noticed his sorrow, and upon hearing the reason for Nehemiah's sadness, the king authorized Nehemiah to go to Jerusalem and make repairs to the city.



Are You Convinced God Will Help You Prosper?

 When Nehemiah arrived in Jerusalem, he immediately faced opposition from those who did not want him to succeed in the task before him. He responded to those who opposed him by saying:



Are You Convinced God Will Help You Prosper?

Nehemiah 2:20 (NKJV)

So I answered them, and said to them, "The God of heaven Himself will <u>prosper us</u>; therefore we His servants will arise and build, but you have no heritage or right or memorial in Jerusalem."



Questions To Ask Yourself.

- Are you firmly convinced today that God desires for you to prosper?
- Are there specific reasons why you believe God will not cause you to prosper?
- Are these reasons related to sin or to the pursuit of a goal that is contrary to God's commandments?
- Are these reasons related to your feelings of failure, your past experience with failure, or your belief that only some of God's children should prosper?

Four Basic Aspects of God's Commitment to Your Success

 The Bible presents four basic concepts that are important for you to grasp if you are to understand God's commitment to your success



1. God Desires For You To Live Successfully Regardless Of Your Outer Circumstances.

 Perhaps no person in the Bible experienced more difficult circumstances in his life—for his entire life—than Daniel. Daniel was taken captive by the Babylonians when he was a young man. He was forced to live in an alien culture the rest of his life and to serve three heathen kings—Nebuchadnezzar, Cyrus, and Darius. On several occasions, Daniel had to stand in opposition to the king's magicians.



1. God Desires For You To Live Successfully Regardless Of Your Outer Circumstances.

 On one occasion, his opposition resulted in his facing a den of lions. Yet we read in Daniel 6:28, "So this Daniel prospered in the reign of Darius and in the reign of Cyrus the Persian." Daniel lived well and lived successfully in the midst of his circumstances. We are called to do the same.



1. God Desires For You To Live Successfully Regardless Of Your Outer Circumstances.

 Too often we look at our outward circumstances and we conclude, "God must not want to prosper me." We must never look to outward circumstances, including our past failures, and use them as a reason to doubt God's desire to prosper us. True prosperity begins in the heart and soul of a person. True prosperity is always a possibility for us because change and spiritual growth are always possible for the Christian.



2. Your success is directly related to your faith.

 For a person to be successful, a person must first believe he or she can be successful. The real question for the Christian is, "Believe in what? Have faith in whom?" When we identify the object of our faith, we truly know the foundation for our success. If you are putting your faith in God to help you define and become a success, then your foundation is as strong as He is!



Do You BELIEVE Today That God WILL Lead You To Greater Success In Your Life?

What the Word Says:

Hebrews 11:6 (NKJV)

But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him.



James 1:5-8 (AMP)

5 If any of you is deficient in wisdom, let him ask of the giving God [Who gives] to everyone liberally and ungrudgingly, without reproaching or faultfinding, and it will be given him.

6 Only it must be in faith that he asks with no wavering (*no hesitating, no doubting*). For the one who wavers (*hesitates, doubts*) is like the billowing surge out at sea that is blown hither and thither and tossed by the wind.

7 For truly, let not such a person imagine that he will receive anything [he asks for] from the Lord, 8 [For being as he is] a man of two minds (hesitating, dubious, irresolute), [he is] unstable and unreliable and uncertain about everything [he thinks, feels, decides].

3. God's commitment to our success is related to our courage and to our obedience in keeping His commandments.



Joshua 1:7–9 (NKJV)

8 This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate in it day and night, that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success.

9 Have I not commanded you? Be strong and of good courage; do not be afraid, nor be dismayed, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go."

The issue for Christians is not whether God is committed to their success, but, rather, whether we are committed to keeping God's commandments, having courage, using our faith, and choosing to believe for success regardless of the outer circumstances of our lives.

4. The Bible Presents Success As A Process, Not A Destination.
