



Luke 9:57–62 (NKJV)

57 Now it happened as they journeyed on the road, that someone said to Him, "Lord, I will follow You wherever You go." 58 And Jesus said to him, "Foxes have holes and birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay His head." 59 Then He said to another, "Follow Me." But he said, "Lord, let me first go and bury my father."





60 Jesus said to him, "Let the dead bury their own dead, but you go and preach the kingdom of God."

61 And another also said, "Lord, I will follow You, but let me first go and bid them farewell who are at my house."

62 But Jesus said to him, "No one, having put his hand to the plow, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God."





- The third man also volunteered, but he could not follow Christ because he was looking back instead of ahead.
- There is nothing wrong with a loving farewell (1 Kings 19:19–21), but if it gets in the way of obedience, it becomes sin.
- Jesus saw that this man's heart was not wholly with Him, but that he would be plowing and looking back.
- You will be moving forward, but always looking back wishing you were somewhere else.





- Satchel Paige and his Good Rule for Living "Don't look back, something may be gaining on you"
- The Bible also calls for not looking back.
- Looking back Hinders Forward Progress in the things God has for you now.
- Looking back may be making you depressed.
- Looking back may be bringing you defeat.

1 John 1:7–9 (NKJV)

7 But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin.

8 If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.

9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.





God really does put our sins away.

Psalm 103:10-12 (NKJV)

10 He has not dealt with us according to our sins, Nor punished us according to our iniquities. 11 For as the heavens are high above the earth, So great is His mercy toward those who fear Him;

12 As far as the east is from the west, So far has He removed our transgressions from us.





Perhaps you believe this for others, but not for yourself, but God has put away all sin, even the ones you consider to be the most serious.





Don't Look Back At Defeats That Get You Down

All people have some defeats in their past. Only those who never attempt anything are free from past defeats.

Psalm 37:23–24 (NKJV)

23 The steps of a good man are ordered by the LORD, And He delights in his way.24 Though he fall, he shall not be utterly cast down; For the LORD upholds him with His hand.



Don't Look Back At Defeats That Get You Down

God lifts up those who fall; therefore, don't allow failing to make you feel you are a failure.



Ecclesiastes 7:10(NKJV) Do not say, "Why were the former days better than these?" For you do not inquire wisely concerning this.

Ecclesiastes 7:10 (NLT) Don't long for "the good old days." This is not wise.

Ecclesiastes 7:10 (The Message) Don't always be asking, "Where are the good old days?" Wise folks don't ask questions like that.



Israel kept looking back to Egypt lying to themselves.

Numbers 11:18–20 (NKJV)

18 Then you shall say to the people, 'Consecrate yourselves for tomorrow, and you shall eat meat; for you have wept in the hearing of the LORD, saying, "Who will give us meat to eat? For it was well with us in Egypt." Therefore the LORD will give you meat, and you shall eat.





because you have despised the LORD who is among you, and have wept before Him, saying, "Why did we ever come up out of Egypt?" ' "




Ecclesiastes 7:10 (NKJV)
